- The **program fee of \$2,299** (shared double room accommodations) **or \$2,999** (single room accommodations) includes the following:

  - Guided walking tour of Reykjavik, Leidarendi caving tour, Northern Lights tour, tour of Fridheimar Greenhouse, admission to the Blue Lagoon, visit to the Global Thermal Energy Plant, and a South Coast sightseeing tour including visits to Seljalandsfoss and Skogafoss waterfalls, Solheimajokull glacier, the black sand beach of Reynisfjara and basalt column cliffs and sea stacks

- **Payments** by admitted participants are by Nov. 17, 2016 (\$1,100) and Feb. 1, 2017 (remaining balance). Failure to pay on time may result in cancellation of participation.
- Accommodations comprise seven nights at a conveniently located hotel with Wi-Fi. Choose a double (shared) room or, for a surcharge, a single room.
- **Meals** included in the program are breakfasts at the hotel, a welcome dinner and a farewell dinner, and a lunch at the Fridheimar Greenhouse. Participants are responsible for other meals.
